PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The students have now attended three after school Sacramental classes in preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation in Week 11 this term.

During these sessions, the students were able to explain the key elements in the program such as:

- What is sin?
- Why do we need to follow God's commandments?
- Explain that this sacrament provides us with an opportunity to acknowledge our mistakes, our estrangement from God and his Church, and our need for conversion and forgiveness
- Explain that sincere sorrow for sin is the most important element for celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Jesus is the Living Water for the world

The woman left her water-jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, 'Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?' (John 4:28-29)



Praise be to God who calls us and raises us up through deep waters into new life!

Reflection on the Gospel of John 4:5-42

Imagine you are going about your business, gathering water at the community well as you do every day, and on this day you encounter a prophet. While you are at the well together, Jesus draws upon your deep connection to this source of water to help

you understand what he calls the 'living water.'

The encounter starts with a simple request: 'Give me a drink.' Beyond your expectations, it ends with you proclaiming this man Jesus as the long-awaited Christ. Now that's a day to remember! Water is one of the ancient human symbols, and indeed one of Christianity's fundamental sacramental symbols. It quenches our thirst; it sustains our crops and livestock. In its absence life cannot flourish, but in its overabundance it can cause death and destruction.

When Jesus then speaks of living water, the woman can almost feel the cool, crisp water refreshing her body after a long drink. Is this what it's like to experience this living water Jesus speaks of?

What are our lives transformed for? For our own salvation? Yes, but not only that. Through Jesus' example, we know this transformation is expressed in transformative action in the world, for its sake and for the sake of our brothers and sisters. Giving witness through our lives is a necessity. Indeed, salvation comes in sharing our experience of the "living water".

Discussing the Gospel with your family

How does your own experience of the ancient symbol of water help you to understand Jesus as 'living water'?

What is the challenge for us today? In what ways does today's Gospel shed light on our interactions with people from different cultures, nationalities and religion?

Attendance is a major focus for St Aidan's this year.

EVERY LEARNER, EVERY DAY is our school slogan for 2017. It is our combined responsibility to have our children at school every day and on time.

Week 2 attendance level 77.8%
Week 3 attendance level is 75.9%
Week 4 attendance level is 84.2%
Week 5 attendance level is 80%
Week 6 attendance level is 79.4%
Week 7 attendance level is 84.1%
Week 8 attendance level is 84.8% (OUR NEW P.B.)

Attendance level target for all Diocesan schools is 90%


Our school needs your help to improve this level. Please remember to plan holidays in the school holidays not during the school term. Incentives for 100% attendance are now in place. Students have received an attendance sheet that is stamped each week if they have been at school. The children receive a sticker if they have been at school. The children receive a sticker if they have been at school with 100% attendance after five weeks and a certificate at the end of the term for 100% attendance.

Parents can help their child's attendance by:

- Being firm. Send your child to school every day unless they are sick
- Develop good sleep and morning routines
- Schedule appointments for after school
- Avoid taking holidays during school terms...their education is extremely important!

Literacy at St Aidan's



PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

To improve literacy amongst our students we encourage them to read every night. One way is through the Premier's Reading Challenge in which St Aidan's is participating. The Reading Challenge promoted by the NSW Premier, began on March 6th and closes August 25th. It is open to students from K-9. Children in K-2 are encouraged to read 30 books over the 5 months. 25 books to be chosen from the reading lists and 5 books that are free choice. Children in 3-9 are encouraged to read 20 books over the 5 months. 15 books to be chosen from the reading lists and 5 books that are free choice.

In the coming weeks kinder students will come home with their login. For those children who have previously participated in the Challenge their login will be the same. If they don't remember their login please advise their teacher. They can log their reading books at home or at school.

Year 5 - Thursday



Numeracy News

What is Place Value?

Place value is the value of a digit in a number (ones, tens, hundreds, thousands etc). Eg. 524 has 5 hundreds, 2 tens and 4 ones.



PLACE VALUE GROWTH POINTS

0	Not yet able to read, write, interpret and order 1 digit numbers.
1	I can read, write, interpret and order 1 digit numbers.
2	I can read, write, interpret and order 2 digit numbers.
3	I can read, write, interpret and order 3 digit numbers.
4	I can read, write, interpret and order numbers beyond 1000.
5	I can apply my knowledge of place value to solve problems.
6	I can apply my knowledge of place value to solve problems involving fractions and decimals.

How can I support my child with their place value goal?

- Make connections to numbers around the world- Encourage your child to read and write different numbers.
- Choose 2-3 numbers relative to their goal (1 digit/2 digit etc) and encourage your child to put them in order from smallest to largest.
- Encourage your child to explain their thinking using place value language Eg. how many tens etc.
- Challenge your child to recall the number ten more/less/one hundred more/less from 3-4 digit numbers. Eg. What is 100 less than 1007.

In the next newsletter I will explore the addition and subtraction growth points and share some more practical ideas.


