

Dear Parents

At a Lenten penance service in St. Peter's Basilica on 13th March, Pope Francis announced an extraordinary jubilee, a Holy Year of Mercy, to highlight the Catholic Church's "mission to be a witness of mercy." The special year will take place 8th December, 2015 until 20th November 2016.

The Extraordinary Jubilee has at its centre the mercy of God. It will be a Holy Year of Mercy. We want to live in the light of the word of the Lord:

#### "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (Lk 6:36).

To mark the opening of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy in the Diocese of Parramatta, a special holy door of mercy will be opened at St Patrick's Cathedral on Sunday 13 December at 11: 00 am mass. The door will be open for pilgrims to pass through as a prayer for personal conversion and action.

The designated door for our Diocese will be the eastern door at the top of the entry steps to St Patrick's Cathedral. The special sense of passing through this threshold of God's mercy will be emphasised until the close of the Jubilee in November 2016. Everyone is invited to make a special pilgrimage to the Cathedral from every region of the archdiocese.

Next year at St Aidan's, we would like to start a parent prayer and meditation group. Meditation is found in all religious traditions. In Christianity it is the heart of the contemplative teaching of Jesus on prayer. Meditation builds community and you are invited, through this weekly opportunity beginning on Thursday the first week of Lent - Week 3 of Term 1, 2016 to become part of this prayer community. You will be able to learn about the tradition, how to meditate and how to continue meditation with your children at home.

#### Numeracy News

Mathematics Assessment Interviews (MAIs) will commence again in the first few weeks of next year. These interviews occur at the beginning of the year to assess what your child has retained over the past year after a holiday period.

What can you do to prepare your child for their MAI?

- Encourage your child to count over the holidays, following on with their personal goals (counting by different numbers, counting by fractions etc.)
- Choose particular numbers and recall the number 1 more, 1 less, 10 more, 10 less, 100 more, 100 less. (49, 599, 1010, 5490)
- Practise placing different numbers on empty number lines and encourage them to explain their thinking.

Most importantly talk to your child about the MAI. Encourage your child to try their best and remind them it is not something they should be nervous about or stress over. The MAI process is an opportunity for your child to show the teacher what they know and can do mathematically and for the teacher to get to know your child.

We look forward to working alongside you again during this process.

What mathematics will you **notice**, **discuss** and **explore** with your child during the holidays?
