Dear Parents,

As you are aware all students at St Aidan's are required to complete an 'Acceptable Use of Technology' agreement. This is completed in Kindergarten and again when a student reaches Year Three.

Technology is a very important tool to enhance learning and all students at St Aidan's are encouraged to use a variety of technologies to this end.

In signing the 'agreement' students and parents agree to use technology in an acceptable manner as follows:

- Use all ICT equipment (under teacher supervision) for educational purposes.
- Follow teacher directions at all times.
- Ask permission from a teacher before following online prompts.
- Behave online with integrity as they would in real life.
- Observe copyright rules and acknowledge the author of information or pictures.
- Keep passwords secure.
- Use internet and email only under teacher supervision.
- Consult a teacher before providing information online.
- Obtain teacher permission before publishing anything online.
- Never write hurtful or inappropriate comments about another person.
- Always use respectful and polite language.
- Ask permission before taking someone's photo or using them in a video.
- Acknowledge the work of others and never claim it as your own.
- Never meet with someone you have met online without parent/guardian approval.
- Never send personal information about yourself to other people.
- ♦ Always tell someone if what you are seeing is inappropriate or offensive.
- Turn off your monitor if someone inappropriate comes on screen.
- Tell someone if you see another person access information that it is not appropriate.

From time to time there are breaches of this policy and the consequences of improper use could be:

- Loss of computer access for a period of time.
- Informing parents/guardians.
- ♦ Informing the Principal.
- ♦ Legal action.

I urge each of you to speak to your children about the appropriate use of technology both at home and at school.

Attached to this newsletter are some tips for parents to keep children safe online. Please take the time to read these tips and discuss with your children.

As advised earlier this term, Parent/teacher interviews will be held in week ten. Information re booking your interviews with teachers will be sent home to each family next Monday 20th June. Please make these interviews a priority as positive partnerships between teachers and parents are very important to children's learning.
