

Familiarisation of School Policies

Medication Policy

Parents of students requiring medication in school hours must inform the secretaries in the school office. Parents **MUST** request the administration of medication in writing. There are forms available at the school office and on the school website.

The following **MUST** be provided in writing:

- date
- •parent/guardian signature
- •name of medication and details of dosage
- •time to be administered
- •duration of the medication
- •acceptance of full responsibility in delegating the administering of the medication to the school.

The medication is to be sent to school in a resealable plastic bag with the child's name and class on the bag. If needed, a spoon or measuring cup is to be supplied with the medication. Students who are asthmatic or who are anaphylactic will require an action plan from their doctor.

Literacy Matters

SPELLING

How you can support your child in learning to spell:

- say speech rhymes and tongue twisters together
- play `detective' games with words. Ask your child to be a detective and find:
- words that rhyme, eg can, fan, man, tan
- words that begin with the same sound, eg sun, sausage, sea
- words that end with the same sound, eg hat, street
- little words in big words, eg 'am' in 'jam'
- words that sound the same but are spelt differently, e.g. ate eight, to two too, their there
- play word games that focus on the sounds of words,
 e.g. Junior Scrabble, Boggle, Word Snap,
 Wonderwords, Junior Crosswords, I Spy, Hangman.

Numeracy News

Tips to support your child in Mathematics this year

- ♦ Always encourage your child. Don't tell them they are wrong; rather look at the logic in their thinking. Why did they make that mistake?
- ♦ Challenge your child to think differently and explain their thinking. Ask them to prove it!
- Stay positive and don't talk about the negative experiences you have had with maths.
- Encourage number sense. Allow your child to understand the size of numbers and practise the skill of adding and subtracting numbers in many different ways.
- Remember that maths is not only about reaching the answer quickly. It is also about working creatively to get the answer and showing mathematical thinking in many different ways.

In the next newsletter I will look at different tasks you can do with children over the holidays.

What Mathematics will you **notice**, **discuss** and **explore** with your child this week?
