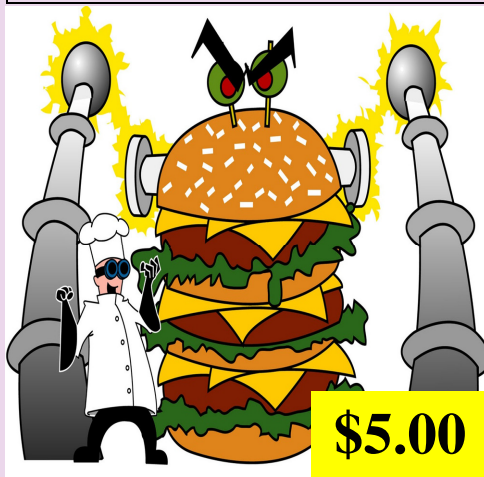

Last week I entered the school in the Daily Telegraph's Champions of the West awards. The project that we entered was 'Enhancing Learning through Technology' with particular emphasis on the work being done through the school's radio and robotics programs. Our teacher/librarian Ms Grace Carlo-Stella facilitates both of these programs. Unfortunately I received word yesterday that our school was not successful in reaching the finals. As far as I'm concerned our teachers and students will always be winners. Well done Ms Carlo-Stella and members of the Radio and Robotics classes.

Thank you to the twenty-two parents who attended the *Healthy Lunch Box* session today which was facilitated by Nina Tan and Fraya Wilson from the Cancer Council NSW. It was an informative workshop and the parents all received a free show bag that included a healthy lunch box kit and planner.

Well done to the parents who have accessed the 'online' interview site to book their interview for week ten this term. As mentioned previously these interviews will involve parent/child/teacher for a fifteen minute discussion about the child's numeracy goal based on the results of their recent MAI (Mathematics Assessment Interview). Our purpose is to ensure that the children are given a voice and are able to articulate their numeracy goal, thus taking more responsibility for their own learning.

NUMERACY NEWS

Place value refers to our understanding when reading, writing, interpreting and ordering different numbers.

Throughout the interview children completed a variety of tasks, which asked them to read, write and interpret numbers from one digit to four digits and beyond including fractions and decimals.

Growth points were assigned to each child based on their responses during their interview. The place value growth points are listed below.

- 0 - Not yet able to read, write interpret and order one digit numbers (to ten).
- 1 -Can read, write, interpret and order one digit numbers (to ten).
- 2 -Can read, write, interpret and order two digit numbers (from ten to one hundred).
- 3 -Can read, write, interpret and order three digit numbers (from one hundred to nine hundred and ninety nine).
- 4 -Can read, write, interpret and order numbers beyond one thousand.
- 5 -Can apply place value knowledge to a variety of problems.
- 6 -Can read, write, interpret and order different fractions and decimals.

In the next newsletter I will explore the addition and subtraction domain with a particular focus on the growth points.

What Mathematics will you **notice**, **discuss** and **explore** with your child this week?
