#### NUMERACY NEWS

Place value refers to our understanding when reading, writing, interpreting and ordering different numbers. Interpreting numbers require students to understand the value of each digit in any number. From the Mathematics Assessment Interview it was evident that children could read and write different numbers, but have difficulty interpreting them.

Children are now encouraged to interpret different numbers by:

- representing numbers using pictures, symbols and words
- making a collection on a bead string and identifying the number of 'tens' and 'ones' in any number.



- structuring objects into groups of hundreds, tens and ones
- placing different numbers on an empty number line and explaining their thinking.
- identifying the number before and after a given number. For example what is 10 more than 406?

In the next newsletter I will begin to explore different activities you can do at home to support your child when interpreting different numbers.

What mathematics will you notice, discuss and explore with your child this week?
